<b>11</b>	Support your local school activities.	<b>12</b>	Meet new neighbors.
<b>13</b>	<a href="#">Apply</a> for a Board or Commission.	<b>14</b>	Give new neighbors information.
<b>15</b>	Meet your Community Resource Officer (CRO). Attend your civic league or call police headquarters at (757) 664-3277 to identify your neighborhood's CRO.	<b>16</b>	Mow your grass regularly during grass season.
<b>17</b>	Report a pothole, burnt out street light, or other issue using the <a href="#">MyNorfolk</a> app or calling Norfolk Cares at (757) 664-6510.	<b>18</b>	Follow guidelines for <a href="#">trash collection</a> .
<b>19</b>	Vote!	<b>20</b>	Don't sweep yard waste into the street and hurt the bay.
<b>21</b>	Report a crime or dangerous situation to 911.	<b>22</b>	Don't place Fats, Oils, and Grease down drains which clog pipes.
<b>23</b>	Plan or volunteer at a neighborhood event.	<b>24</b>	Support local businesses.
